

REMEMBER ON COLLECTION DAY

- 1 The carts should be placed at the curbside no later than 6:00 am on collection day and removed from the curbside within 12 hours after service.
- 2 The carts should be placed with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.
- 3 Place carts side-by-side approximately 1 foot apart & at least 3 feet from any obstruction (i. e. vehicles, fire hydrants, trees).
- 4 Items placed outside of carts will not be collected. Cart lids should be closed. Please do not overload.

TEMPORARY COLLECTIONS

Larger waste collection containers (from 3 yards to 40 yards) are available for clean-up projects and other disposal needs. For additional pricing details or to arrange for a delivery of a larger container to your residence or business, please call CR&R Customer Service.



BULKY ITEMS

Items that cannot fit in your automated carts are considered bulky items.

EXAMPLES OF BULKY ITEMS INCLUDE:

- Couches
- Desks
- Chairs
- Tables
- Mattresses

**NEW RESIDENTS:** If you are a new resident you may use your bulky item service to collect all of your paper, cardboard and packing material.

WHITE GOODS HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES

White Goods, or household appliances containing Freon are picked up similar to a bulky item. Refrigerators contain Freon and other chemicals that require special handling. For more information on requesting this service, please call CR&R Customer Service.

E-WASTE

Electronic Waste (e-waste) is anything with a circuit board, electrical plug or battery. It is illegal to dispose of e-waste in any of your automated carts. CR&R will collect and legally dispose of and recycle these items.

EXAMPLES OF E-WASTE INCLUDE:

- Monitors
- Cell Phones
- Computers
- Televisions
- Printers

SHARPS\*

CR&R offers residents a unique, safe and convenient Sharps Disposal by Mail Program. If requested, a Sharps container will be delivered to your home in a postage prepaid return-by-mail shipping box with instructions in english and spanish. When the Sharps container is full or when your drug therapy is concluded, simply return the Sharps container in its original packaging. Rates and restrictions apply. HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household Hazardous Wastes (HHW) are products that are flammable, corrosive, reactive or toxic. They are dangerous to the public and the environment.

EXAMPLES OF HHW INCLUDE:

- Fluorescent Light Tubes
- Household Batteries
- Latex or Water Based Paint
- Thermostats
- High Intensity Discharge Lamps

New Year's Day	Labor Day
Memorial Day	Thanksgiving Day
Independence Day	Christmas Day

If the Holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, trash will be collected on your normal collection day with no delays to your pickup.

If the Holiday falls during the work week, collection for the remainder of the week will be delayed by one day. For example, if Independence Day falls on a Monday, and your normal collection day is on Thursday, your pickup for that week will be on Friday.

CR&R provides Christmas tree collection for a two week period following the holiday season. The following guidelines are for residential curbside collection of Christmas trees:

- Please remove all ornaments, tinsel, lights and stands.
- Do not place trees in plastic bags.
- Place tree in your green organics cart or beside your carts for collection.
- Trees 6 feet or taller must be cut in half.

Palm fronds are not recyclable. Please place cut palm fronds in the trash cart.
